RUB OF THE GREEN

The Red Green is holding up well this winter is and responding to our winter fertiliser program.

Algae has been a problem this year, most evident in worn areas of the green from foot traffic and shaded areas, especially the northern edges of both greens.

We have been using a variety of different methods including aeration. We used the Air2g2 machine which pushed a rod 300mm into the soil then ejected compressed air into the soil profile. This is used to open all locked-up pore spaces and is very effective at increasing drainage with minimal disturbance to the green. We have also been applying fungicides to control the algae. Liquid iron also is used to dry out the algae.

We are trialling Florentine Blackout, a unique blend of microbes and enzymes which are target specific. They aggressively compete for algae food sources and assist in the breakdown of surface residue left by algae proliferation.

The Blue Green has not been responding to our liquid fertiliser and granular program. Mites have also been prolific in sections of the green. These stressed areas are sunken, thinning turf that developed algae.

Treatment for the algae worked then, when dry, it crusted up as we predicted in the last "Rub of the Green" report. Areas were top-dressed and fertilised multiple times with results not what we were expecting due to continuing rain.

Plugs have been taken from these troubled areas and, under inspection, we have discovered many ground pearl cysts/nymphs. This is the main cause of the sick, sunken wear turf areas that have developed algae. I will post some photos of these on the notice board.

We have contacted the chemical manufacturer and asked if we can use a more intensive spray program to control this. We have been approved by the manufacturer to apply three applications over a 6-week period to aid in the control and recovery of these areas.

Greens are needing a solid aeration, allowing more oxygen into the roots to encourage new strong root growth for the spring season. Aeration practices are critical for controlling pearl cysts.

Members can be assured that active measures are being undertaken to ensure the best possible outcome for players to compete on top quality surfaces.
