Club Championship Men's Fours

Round 1

The Sunshine State turned on the magic again for the first round of this competition. Saturday 12 April, 32 men on the green, what could go wrong?

Thunder and lightning, and some rain, ensured only about an hour of play was possible, or 6 or 7 ends, so the first-round games were played over two legs with games being completed last week.

Another close game saw Don Anderson, Graham Legg, Tim Salway and Bill Mills (S) go down fighting 16-18 against Lloyd Edwards, Brian Vandersee, Robin Town / Max Grey and Peter Fairchild (S). This was a very tight game throughout eventually won by the more consistent bowlers.

If any of you have family or friends who are looking for a new activity that ticks all the boxes? Invite them to come and try lawn bowls at our wonderful club to meet people and learn new skills.

We are running a come and try lawn bowls program as part of the BCC's Active & Healthy program with the aim of attracting new bowlers.

The program commences on Sunday 27 April and runs for six consecutive weeks where we encourage those new to bowls to give it a go. The sessions run for approx 1.5 hours and commence at 11.00 hrs and wind up around 12:30 hours. All bowling equipment and tuition is provided free.

If participants go on to join the Club, free one on one coaching is provided to initially get the new bowlers started and later to assist them progress through the bowling ranks as they become more familiar with the game.
