# YOU ARE AT THE HEAD. A BOWL IS HEADING FOR THE DITCH. WHAT DO YOU DO?

### **NOTHING!**

Your first instinct may be to stop the bowl from dropping into the ditch. Why? It may get sand on it or you may have to bend further to pick it up and put it on the bank. You know it will be dead – end of story. Wrong!

What you have done is interfere with a bowl in motion and this is against the rules. There is a penalty to be paid for this according to the Laws of the Sport of Bowls - 37.1.4

Briefly, the opposing skip has a choice to make – to place the bowl where they believe it would have come to rest or to declare the end dead.

In a competition game such as pennants, having the end declared dead would be a bad outcome, particularly if your team was holding several shots. Let the bowl run, finish its course and don't interfere.

The same is true for a jack. If the lead delivers it too strongly and it is headed for the ditch, don't stop it. Always let it drop into the ditch or come to a halt before the ditch. Let it run its course. If it stops before the ditch, place it on the T. If the jack drops into the ditch, pick it up and return it to let the opposition lead deliver it unless the opposition lead has already failed in their delivery. Then, it will be placed on the T and the mat replaced by the first lead. Similar penalties apply to bowls and jacks if stopped as already outlined above.

This article refers to the ditch but it also applies to the side boundaries of the rink. Wait until the bowl or jack has passed beyond the side boundaries of the rink with no hope of turning back before you stop and lift it.
