CARE OF YOUR BOWLS AND YOUR PERSONAL HEALTH

Let's ask ourselves a brutal question – When was the last time you cleaned your bowls? Think about where they have been. Yes, running up and down the greens, picking up residue from fertiliser and pesticides as well as dried remains of duck poo. Yuck! The sticky cream on your hands makes extra sure that stuff will cling to your bowls.

That's a very good reason for washing your hands when you leave the green for afternoon tea or post-match drinks. Meanwhile, your bowls sit quietly in your bag waiting for their next outing when you'll put them on the rink to work your magic. Your hands will be touching whatever remained on their surface from their last outing. It isn't enough to give them a quick wipe with your dry bowls cloth. Why not consider giving them a good wash at home occasionally to remove unseen residue with associated bacteria? No need to become paranoid about it but a thorough cleanse on a regular basis would not go amiss.

WHO CHANGES THE SCOREBOARD DURING A GAME?

Players who are in the position of skip should know this small but necessary duty which they need to perform.

The skip who has just lost that end is the person who changes the scoreboard. The winning skip is standing down on the green along the centre line showing their lead where they would like to have the jack rolled for the next end.

REPORT ON OUR GREENS

Blue Green Renovation

The renovation of the Blue Green is progressing well although we are in urgent need of rain. Only 2mm was recorded on Saturday. We've observed some areas of blue couch coming through which will be spot-sprayed in the coming days. Additionally, where ground pearl previously affected growth, we're seeing slow regrowth. To address this, plugs will be taken from the sides of the green this week and inserted into the worst-affected areas. We anticipate a very light mow later this week. If conditions remain dry, the green will also be lightly rolled. Rolling can only occur if the ground is completely dry, as even slight dampness would cause the roller to pick up fertiliser and create an uneven surface. Finally, a light fertiliser application will be reapplied.

Red Green Maintenance

Mites are beginning to appear on the edges of the Red Green and spraying will be conducted to manage them. This green will also receive a light fertilising. Mowing of the edges will be very light to assist in growth. Steve is pleased with how the Red Green is performing especially given the heavy usage and ongoing lack of rain.
