## Mark's Final Thoughts on Completion of First Aid Training

Mark Benson and Vaughan Thomas are now First Aid and Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) qualified. This means that we can save your life or take it from you if we get it wrong. It is now routine to occasionally give a patient a mouth-to-mouth puff if one's arms ache from doing a lot of chest compression. We practised on adult and child mannikins which displayed different lights if we were compressing too much or too little, too fast or too slow.

At the end of the practical session, our trainer, who was also the examiner and quite a good-sized fellow, asked if there was anything else he could do to help us. He was a bit surprised when someone asked if we could have him on the floor! He breathed a sigh of relief when we explained to him that we wanted to practise turning an unconscious person lying on his back into the recovery position on his side. Quite easy when you know how!
