Roles of Players in a Fours Game

These role descriptions below could be helpful for those playing in fours pennant games. They are also useful for new bowlers who may need guidance on what is required to be a good lead and/or second in any game.

The requirements of the thirds and skips will be covered in next week's SLBC News. Stay tuned!

Lead

- 1. This player wants to be a specialist and is happy in the position.
- 2. The lead is guided by the skip in where to place the mat and should then roll the jack to where the skip is standing on the centre line.
- 3. Accurate jack rolling and consistent good drawing are the two major skills required. A toucher in front of the jack and the other bowl just behind the jack is a valuable format for the lead to achieve. Getting the two bowls within a mat length of the jack is an excellent result. A good start from the lead is inspirational for the team.
- 4. Be completely absorbed in the process being performed but also very aware of what is going on around you.
- 5. Make your positive contribution to team morale.
- 6. Use relaxation strategies to occupy your waiting time and follow what's happening in the game.
- 7. Leads do not stay on the rink after they have finished delivering their bowls
- 8. Leads do not remain on the rink when the team has crossed to allow the skip to deliver their bowls
- 9. Leads do not participate in counting the shots at the finish of the end. That is the responsibility of the thirds.
- 10. Do not voice any suggestions for team tactics. Others have that role.

Second

- 1. This player is capable of delivering a bowl both forehand and backhand.
- 2. They stand behind the mat, relaxing and awaiting instructions from the skip. They do not pre-empt any shot required but have an open mind to the skip's instruction.
- 3. Seconds need a high degree of self-discipline.
- 4. Numbers 4, 5, 6 and 7 (seconds) from above also apply here.
- 5. Seconds do not remain on the rink while the skip delivers their bowls.
- 6. They do not participate in counting the shots at the completion of the end. That is the responsibility of the thirds.

A good strategy for team members is that you follow the skip's instructions. Don't argue with the skip. They have that responsibility due to their experience and, as they are standing right at the head, they have the best view of what the situation is and can advise you how to play your bowl for the result which will benefit your team.
