RUB OF THE GREEN

I have been asked about our new roller and the effect of rolling on the green. Speaking with our green-keeper, Steve, about the goals he is aiming to produce for the Club, I have attempted to set out what he and I, on behalf of the Management Committee, are looking for in greens preparation.

My apologies to Steve in advance if I have reflected his comments poorly. I am still learning and sometimes get a bit overloaded by the technicalities of the science of greenkeeping.

To understand rolling with our new roller, we need to reflect on what we are seeking regarding speed of the greens over the period of the year and through various weather conditions.

The first objective we have is to produce greens conducive to providing the best bowling for members and this relates to speed and flatness of the green.

To remind members and especially new members, I will start with how speed is measured. The speed of a green is measured in seconds – specifically, how long it takes a bowl to travel 27 metres from mat to jack on a smooth, level surface when delivered with a standard action. This is called the green speed. That definition is taken from the Bowls Rule Book. To understand exactly how that relates in practice, you need to speak with one of our more experienced members as I have had difficulty getting my head around how it is measured on the day.

The Management Committee is seeking the following:

- Club general play around 12–14 seconds
- Competition play around 14–16 seconds

In practice, rolling should aim to maintain our green in the 13–16 second range. Rolling compacts the surface, smooths imperfections and so increases speed.

- Over-rolling can stress the turf and reduce grass health.
- The balance is to roll enough for bowls speed but not so much that you damage the grass roots.
- Consideration is also given to the speed of the rolling. Too slow and we compact the grass and root system. Too fast and it just polishes the surface.
- Remember grass also grows during the day so it will raise up during the day and the blades will follow the sun.

Steve assesses required frequency of rolling and this will vary with weather conditions with consideration to the surface, etc. During the growing season and heavy competition periods, the green will be rolled more regularly.

The timing of rolling is generally after mowing and normally in the morning. Steve avoids rolling when the soil is very wet because of the risk of compaction which causes root stress.

Our new roller is slightly heavier than the old one. It has three speed settings. Currently, we are rolling at the lowest speed and will review that over the next period.

I hope this provides some more information for members to understand the many considerations that are undertaken each week about green preparation.
